## **Changes to COVID-19 Guidance**

Happy new year to you all.

As you will no doubt be aware, there have been a number of changes to the COVID-19 guidance since I wrote to you on 6th December. Please find these below:-

- 1. Pupils are now required to wear face coverings in classrooms. Your child must bring a suitable face covering(s) to school each day as part of their essential equipment.
- 2. Even if your child has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 90 days, they are strongly encouraged to take part in LFD testing in school and at home once they have completed their isolation period for their prior infection. Pupils should therefore attend for testing in school as per the schedule below.

When pupils are not in school for testing on Wednesday and Thursday, they should complete the work provided to them prior to the Christmas break.

- 3. The 10 day self-isolation period for people who record a positive PCR test result for COVID-19 has been reduced to 7 days in most circumstances, unless you cannot test for any reason. Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of selfisolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. If both these test results are negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation after the second negative test result and return to school from day 7. Evidence of two negative LFD tests should be emailed to postbox@etonecollege.co.uk prior to your child returning to school.
- 4. Daily testing for close contacts of COVID-19 People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take an LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend school as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

Close contacts in schools are now identified by NHS Test and Trace and schools are no longer expected to undertake contact tracing.
