

Russendisko - Wladimir Kaminer

They changed the way they talked, the way they walked, what they read, where they went. They cut off from their parents. They took English lessons and opened bank accounts. Fifteen years later, they all have the right haircuts and drive the right cars, but who are they? Where are they going? Russendisko is the story of Wladimir, Andrej and Mischa, three young Russian friends, who move from Moscow to Berlin in a lucky wave of emigration right after the fall of the Berlin wall. They take their chance looking for a better life and find themselves involved in the tales of everyday lunacy on the streets of Berlin and its spirit of the early nineties. Russendisko is a modern fairy tale, a story of friendship, of love, of dreams and the search for happiness and its fulfilment.



Fundbüro – Siegfried Lenz

This story is set in the 1990s and focuses on the life of 24year-old Henry Neff, who has no career ambitions or aims in life, other than to live and let live. He finds his ideal workplace in the lost-andfound office of his local train station, where he is constantly amazed by what people lose. Henry strikes up a friendship with Fedor Lagutin, a visiting academic at the local university. He seems perfectly happy until job cuts at the station and incidents of violence and xenophobia force Henry to reassess his outlook on life.
