### Charity Initiatives 2022

As we enter the season of goodwill, it is at this time that we encourage Etone pupils to engage with active citizenship and take part in the activities that provide support and relief for those in our local community who are in need. By taking part in the initiatives below, it provides pupils with the chance to show some of their Etone Values that, as an Etone Learner, they act on each and every day.

#### Nuneaton Foodbank

The Nuneaton Foodbank initiative collects, organises and distributes food all over the local area for people who really need it. Each year at Etone we support the local foodbank by having a drive to provide some food items and basic toiletries to ensure that over the Christmas period, so everyone can have a merry Christmas. Etone pupils will be invited to deliver the food items themselves on Monday 12th December to the foodbank.

#### Salvation Army Toy Drive

This year we are also taking part in the Salvation Army Nuneaton Toy Drive. Every year, the Salvation Army organise a toy drive within the Nuneaton community to collect and distribute presents for disadvantaged children, to help them celebrate Christmas. We are asking for either gifts or unwanted presents as donations to the cause. All donations are gratefully received and ensure Christmas joy is spread to those who are experiencing hardship. Children aged between 0 to 16 years of age are supported in this toy drive. The Etone Charity Committee will then be delivering the items to the Salvation Army centre on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> December.

Although there is no expectation that pupils take part in the drives, if you can support either of the initiatives it would be a great help to someone in the local community who might be a neighbour, friend, or family member.
