As part of the GCSE Geography course students are required to complete a fieldwork investigation which is based on an investigation carried out on a field trip, additionally Rivers is one of the topics studied for the GCSE specification meaning it will also support their work in lessons. The visit will focus on the physical features and processes involved in the formation of rivers. Throughout the day students will carry out a range of surveys and data collection techniques which will be used in their exam.

As this trip forms the basis of the fieldwork investigation element of the course for the unit 3 exam it is essential all students studying Geography attend. The cost of the trip will be covered by the school as it is a requirement of the course.

The trip is scheduled to take place on Wednesday 24th January 2024. Transport to and from Carding Mill Valley is by coach. Students will need to meet at the main College site in the Café at 8.30am and will return to Etone at around 4pm. Students should wear sensible walking shoes as the terrain is uneven and the day will involve hill walking. Students and are not required to wear College uniform as the whole day will be outdoors with no shade or shelter, students are advised to check the weather and dress accordingly, a coat and appropriate shoes are essential. A packed lunch is required for the trip as there is nowhere to purchase food, and any students claiming free school meals can collect a meal from the Café before departure.
