



## YEAR 7

Meine Welt und ich (Spring half term 2)

During the second half of this term your child will start to develop their knowledge and understanding of the German language and culture by building on the foundations of learning laid in Key Stage 2.

Over the course of the term your child will learn:

- The German alphabet and German phonics
- How to count in German
- How to greet someone and introduce themselves
- Days of the weeks, months of the year and how to give dates, including birthdays
- Understanding masculine, feminine and neutral nouns

## YEAR 8

Ich liebe Ferien (Spring half term 1) and Bist du Medienfan? (Spring half term 2)

This term your child will be continuing to develop their knowledge and understanding of the German language and culture by building on the foundations laid in Year 7.

Over the course of the term your child will learn:

- How to talk about their holidays, including vocabulary about holiday activities, how to ask and answer what their holiday was like, using the past tense with accuracy, and saying how you travelled on holiday.
- How school holidays in a German speaking country compares with that in the UK
- To use the past tense with increasing accuracy
- How to say what you prefer to do
- How to use simple negative structures
- How to talk about tv programmes, film, technology, different hobbies, and music.
- How to use the verb wollen and other modal verbs
- Using three tenses together



## YEAR 9

Musik (Spring half term 1) and Meine Kleidung (Spring half term 2)

This term your child will be continuing to develop their knowledge and understanding of the German language and culture by building on the foundations laid in Year 7 & 8.

Over the course of the term your child will learn:

- Over the course of the term your child will learn: How to talk about different genres of music
- How to give an opinion on different types of music and different artists
- To talk about what instruments they play
- To talk about music festivals, including any they've been to or would like to go to
- Subject and direct object pronouns
- How to form and use comparative and superlative adjectives
- Using four tenses together
- How to talk about articles of clothing, what we wear and when, and using a variety of adjectives
- How to describe a picture in German
- How to use irregular verbs in the 3rd person singular
- What fashion is like in German
