The Department for Education requires us to deliver the statutory guidance for Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE). This, alongside other key areas such as RE, Citizenship and Careers, makes up our Learning for Life curriculum which is delivered at all Key Stages through assemblies, form time activities and LFL lessons.

A session has been arranged on 19th January 2024 for Year 9 students looking at how to deal with and prevent self-harm as a part of this programme. The performance is delivered by an external agency called Loudmouth and is age appropriate. The pastoral staff will consider those pupils for whom this may be a very sensitive topic and these pupils will be managed accordingly.
