Again, it has been another busy term here in Etone Library. A total of over 1,100 books have been loaned. Some of most popular books have included, The Lottie Brooks series, Football Superstars, Little People, Big Dreams The Dork Diaries, and a new addition to our library, The Sad Ghost Club.

### Scholastic Book Fair

Our next book fair will be taking place from Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> - Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> March 2025. Pupils are invited to come along at break and before and after School to purchase their chosen book/books or to complete their wish list to take home. Parents/carers are invited to come along each day after school from 3.15-5.00pm to enjoy browsing the fair with their children along with some refreshments.

There will be something for every pocket at the fair: **approximately 24% of titles are under £5. Book packs start from £1.99. Pupils may also use their £1 World Book Day token for a discount on any title at the fair.**

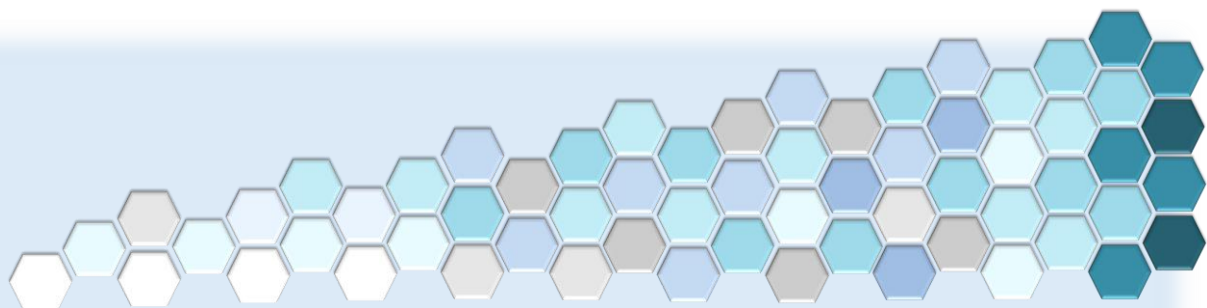
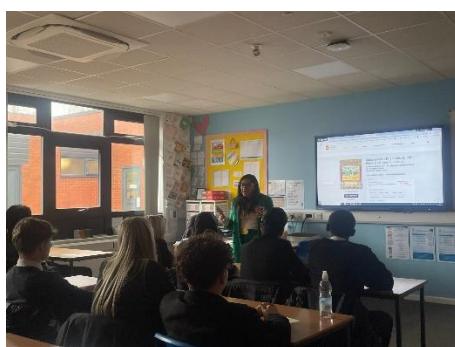
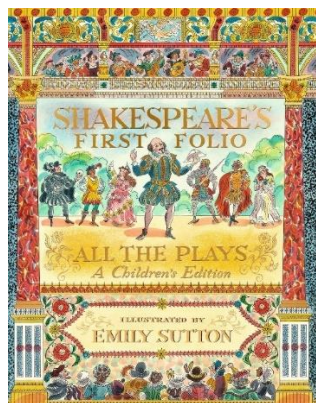
## Dr Anjna Chouhan – Shakespeare's First Folio Facsimile

We were recently extremely lucky to be visited by Dr Anjna Chouhan, editor of Shakespeare's First Folio All The Plays – Children's Edition. She gave a fascinating talk to Year 11 about why she wanted to collate Shakespeare's plays and how she wanted to make Shakespeare more accessible to children; she also outlined her research processes. Our year 11 class were enthralled and asked her some brilliant questions.

Anjna also brought a very special item that will be on display in our Library until the end of February, Shakespeare's First Folio Facsimile. The First Folio is the first published collection of Shakespeare's plays, produced seven years after his death, titled 'Mr. William Shakespeare's Comedies, Histories & Tragedies'. This edition grouped the plays into those categories—comedies, histories, and tragedies—for the first time.

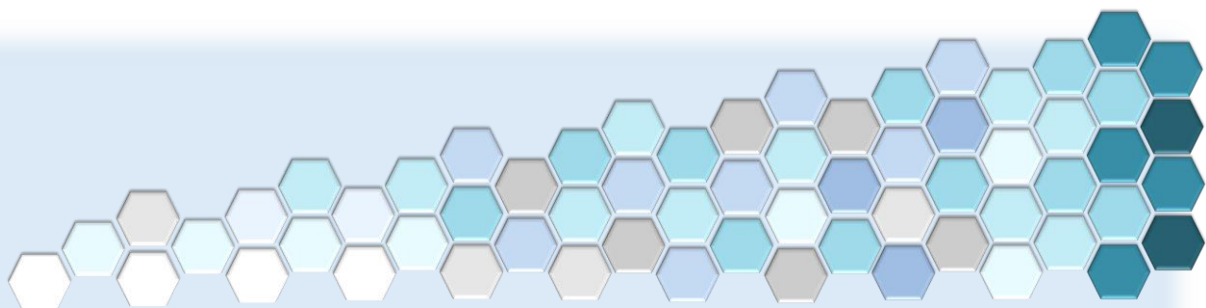
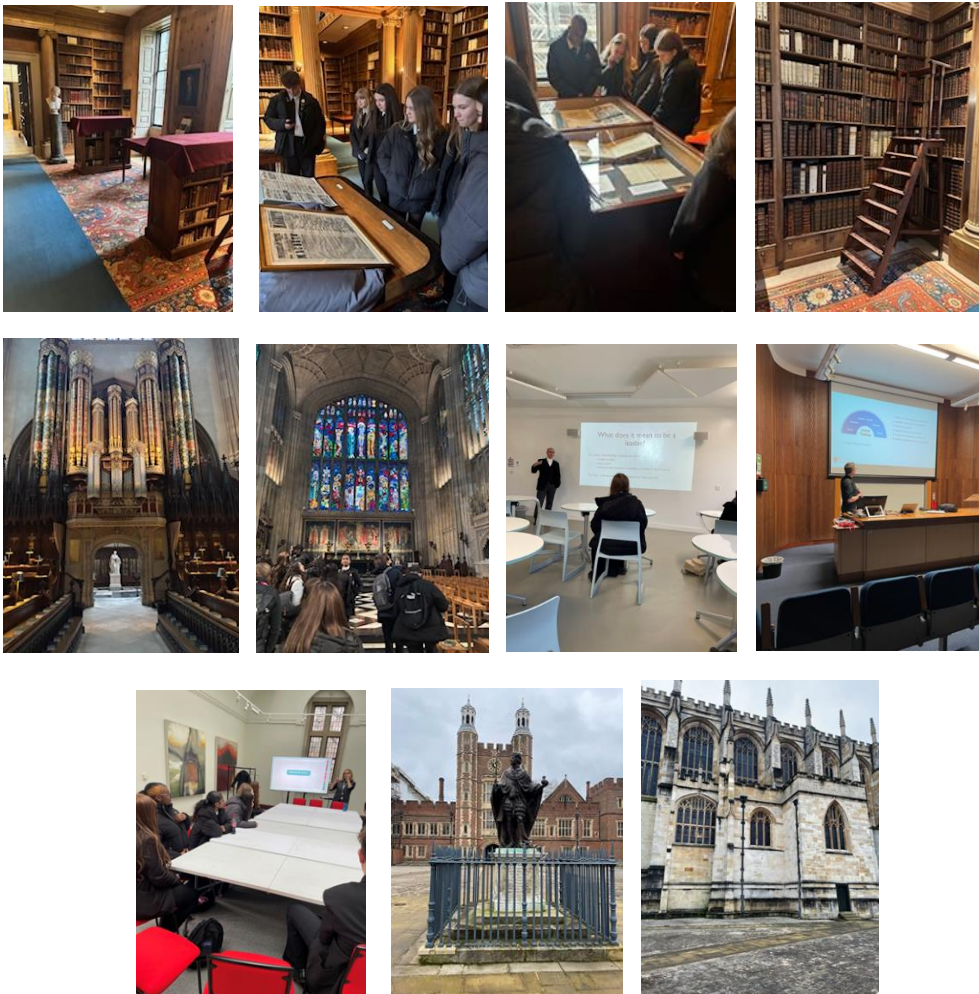
This first folio facsimile has visited 26 libraries across Warwickshire. Etone College is the only School that has the privilege of hosting this in our library. The word 'folio' comes from the Latin word *folium*, which means leaf or sheet. Only 235 copies of the First Folio have been found around the world! Etone pupils are invited to come along, have a look at the folio and annotate any section of the folio which has meaning for them e.g. maybe the first Shakespeare play they read.

Dr Chouhan commented, "Thank you for your kind hospitality today. I enjoyed meeting you and hearing all about the work you do with library lessons at Etone College. I had a wonderful morning, and the students were a thorough pleasure to speak with."



## Visit to Eton College

On Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> February we had the wonderful opportunity of taking Year 10 students on an aspirational trip to Eton College, Windsor. During the day our pupils got to see the everyday life of students, as well as attending informative workshops on critical thinking, leadership and self-leadership, and careers advice. We also had the chance to tour the College, including the Library, which holds hundreds of rare books which must be stored under certain conditions in order to maintain their original condition. ## Reward Trip – Nuneaton Library

Etone Exceeding Excellence visited Nuneaton Library this week to complete research for their projects. Pupils finalised their question on a topic of their choice; then used the resources available at the Library: books, computers, laptops and research catalogues to begin to compile their responses. Etone pupils did an amazing job at coming up with some really thought provoking questions:

The trip offered pupils an insight in the different ways they can carry out research and how using several different types of resources can be useful. The visit was thoroughly enjoyed by all and the staff at Nuneaton Library commented on how articulate, intelligent, polite, and well-mannered Etone pupils are.

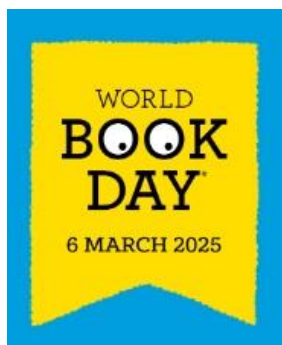


## Blue Monday and Children's Mental Health Week 3<sup>rd</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> February 2025

## Grease – The Musical

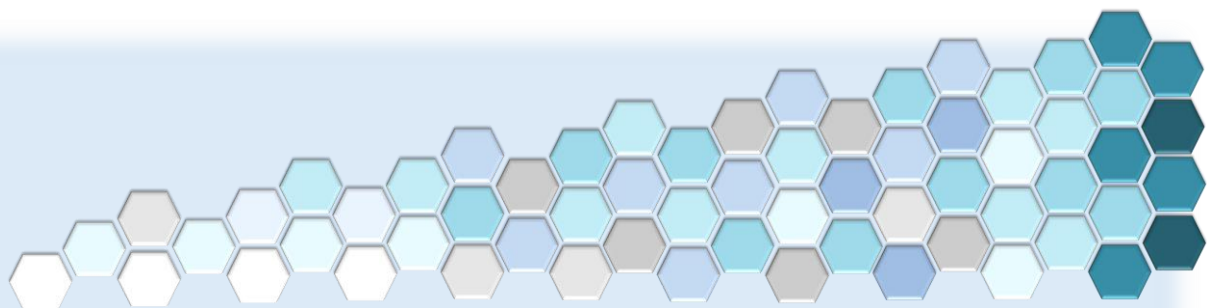

Etone students, from years 7 to 12 whether acting, singing, dancing, designing, playing in the band, editing sound and planning lighting, or stage managing were ready to showcase their talents and dedication to the creation of this large-scale school musical. ## Warwickshire Secondary Book Award

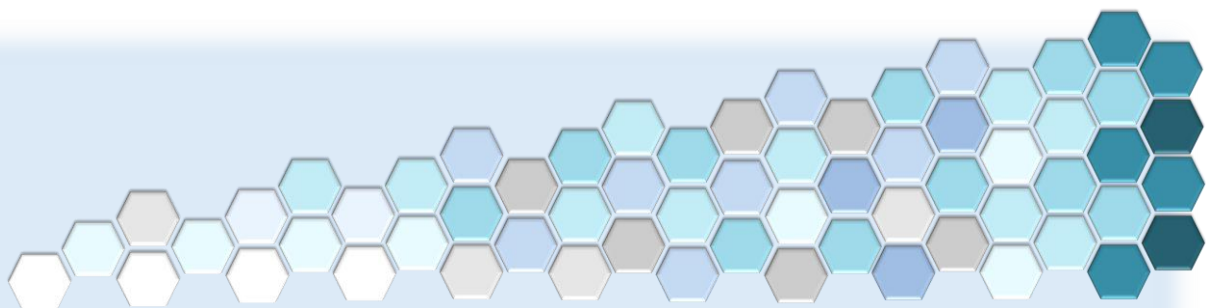
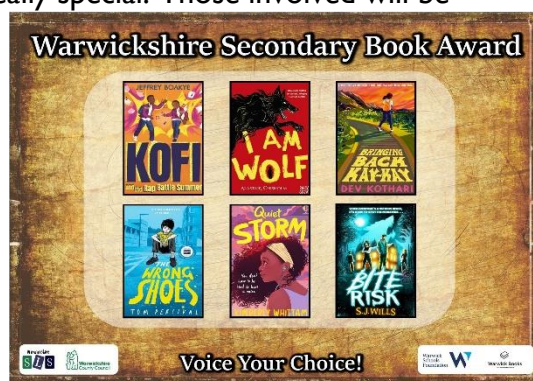
We are delighted to announce our involvement in the Warwickshire Secondary Book Award 2025.
