Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) – Level 3 Qualification



The EPQ allows you to learn and develop skills that you then apply to your own independent research project. The enrichment lessons will be used to teach you these skills, the research project itself will be completed in your own time. There is the choice of presenting your project as a 5,000 word essay or as an artefact accompanied by a 1,000-5,000 word essay.

The EPQ has four assessment objectives:

Manage – identify, design, plan and carry out a project. Apply a range of skills, strategies and methods to achieve objectives.

Use resources – research, critically select, organise and use information, and select and use a range of resources. Analyse data relevantly. Demonstrate understanding of the links, connections and complexities of your chosen topic.

Develop and Realise – select and use a range of skills, take decisions critically and achieve planned outcomes.

Review – evaluate all elements of your project

Great for: Showing your interests to potential universities (some include the qualification in their offers). Showing readiness for university life. Developing your knowledge beyond the specification of one of your chosen level 3 subjects.

UCAS Points: Successful completion of the EPQ earns UCAS points.



Mathematical Studies (Core Maths)



Maths is seen everywhere and used more often than we realise. It is a subject that is for everyone. Core Maths is a diverse, engaging and essential course that looks to equip students with skills for everyday life and to further advance their career prospects.

The course is assessed across two exam papers. The first focusing on the compulsory content units of 3.1, 3.2 and 3.3. The second focusing on the content of 3.4, 3.5, 3.6 and 3.7.

Compulsory content

- 3.1 Analysis of data
- 3.2 Maths for personal finance
- 3.3 Estimation
- 3.4 Critical analysis of given data and models

Additional content

- 3.5 The normal distribution
- 3.6 Probabilities and estimation
- 3.7 Correlation and regression

Throughout this course, students will learn how Maths is all around them and how it is used every day, regardless of course, career or ambition, and how to use this Maths to help further understand the world outside of college.

Entry Requirements

- GCSE Maths Grade 5 or above
- Grade 4 in four other subjects including English Language

Equivalent to an AS Level. Must be taken in addition to three other subjects.

Great for: Students who want additional maths. Some Universities give you reduced entry requirements with this qualification.

UCAS Points: Successful completion of this qualification earns UCAS points.

Suitable for: This course is suitable for those students who would like to study Further Education or Higher Education courses which have mathematical content or pursue a career in a range of different areas including Physics, general science, Engineering, Banking and Finance, Business, Event Management and Planning, Medicine and Teaching.
