Etone College Sixth Form offers a wide range of enrichment opportunities designed to help students develop skills, explore new interests and prepare for their next steps after Post-16 study. There are also opportunities to build leadership and employability skills through Subject Ambassador roles, volunteering, Duke of Edinburgh and Sustainability Ambassador projects.
